
International Virtual Conference on Interdisciplinary Scope of Human Development






Conducted an international virtual conference on “**Interdisciplinary Scope of Human Development**” on 15th and 16th February 2021. The conference was inaugurated by Dr. Sister Arpana, the Principal, Mount Carmel College. There were six sessions by six eminent speakers, Dr. Shagufa Kapadia (MS University , Baroda) spoke on “Human development in everyday living”, Dr. Priti Desai (East Carolina University, USA) spoke on ‘Promoting psychological care for children in health care settings’, Dr. Rekha Sharma Sen (IGNOU), spoke on ‘Academic and research opportunities in the field of Human Development’, Ms. Katie Wood (Brody School of Medicine , USA), spoke on ‘Advocacy: Working with children and families in maltreatment’, Dr. Jigisha Shastri (Azim Premji University), spoke on ‘Rewarding careers in Early Childhood Care and Education’ and Dr. Geetha Chopra (Delhi University), spoke on ‘Applied areas in Human Development: Avenues for professional development’. There were around 28 oral research papers presentations and 18 poster presentations. Around 200 students, academicians and research scholars participated in the conference. The department of Human Development raised Rs. 68000/- through this conference.







Situations that should be reported

- It is reported the child was injured doing something that is not developmentally able to do
- The injury is too severe to have been caused in the manner reported
- The injuries are to the child's buttocks, genital area, abdomen, back, sides of the body or back of the hands
- The story of how the injury happened changes when it is challenged
- Injuries that have not been medically treated
- Injuries that show a pattern
- Human bite marks
- Patches of hair pulled out and the scalp shows signs of bleeding
- Multiple injuries on multiple parts of the body in various stages of healing
- Burns on the child's body that don't appear accidental
- The child discloses abuse
